A. Higher Education and the Poor in Asia: Christian Responses to Issues on Poverty and Justice – *Kumar Aryal, Michael Carino, Tom Roxas, Cris Uy*

The Fourth Industrial Revolution (Industry 4.0) will bring unprecedented technological breakthroughs, such as artificial intelligence (AI), robotics, the internet of things (IoT), autonomous vehicles, and nanotechnology. These innovations will radically transform entire countries, economies, and communities, providing enormous growth potential as well as raising serious moral, ethical, and justice concerns. How should educators and leaders in Christian higher education respond to Industry 4.0? This resource track will explore how focusing on uniquely human skills can be an effective way to advance justice work in Industry 4.0.
